





Eva Traube Abrams, a semi-retired librarian in Florida, is shelving books when her eyes lock on a photograph in the New York Times. She freezes; it's

The accompanying article discusses the looting of libraries by the Nazis across Europe during World War II—an experience Eva remembers well—and the search to reunite people with the texts taken from them so long ago. The book in the photograph, an eighteenth-century religious text thought to have been taken from France in the waning days of the war, is one of the most fascinating cases. Now housed in Berlin's Zentral- und Landesbibliothek library, it appears to contain some sort of code, but researchers don't know where it came from—or what the code means. Only Eva holds the answer, but does she have the strength to revisit old memories?

As a graduate student in 1942, Eva was forced to flee Paris and find refuge in a small mountain town in the Free Zone, where she began forging identity documents for Jewish children fleeing to neutral Switzerland. But erasing people comes with a price, and along with a mysterious, handsome forger named Rémy, Eva decides she must find a way to preserve the real names of the children who are too young to remember who they really are. The records they keep in *The Book of Lost Names* will become even more vital when the resistance cell they work for is betrayed and Rémy disappears.

An engaging and evocative novel reminiscent of *The Lost Girls of Paris* and *The Alice Network*, *The Book of Lost Names* is a testament to the resilience of the human spirit and the power of bravery and love in the face of evil.

You will be able to view and select the dates and positions you would like to volunteer for: Set Up (mainly in the month of September). The Sale (Oct 7-9). Clean Up (Oct 7-13). Please let us know if you need help with the process or do not receive email. We can help you with the electronic program or put your name on the paper roster.

Because of COVID-19 restrictions the sale was moved from March to October, which means that most of our winter visitors, many of whom are enthusiastic volunteers, will not be back to Tucson in time to help us this year. We are therefore asking those in town: PLEASE come as often as you can. We need a great deal of help, as all 10 pods are at, or nearly at, capacity. There will be LOTS of stuff to get out and display and store for the March 2021 sale (yes, we hope to be back on track from that point forward).

- Mattresses of any size, condition, or quality.
- Mechanical beds and chairs (medical or lift type).
- Large appliances (stoves, refrigerators, dishwashers, built-in microwaves or ovens, washers, dryers, etc.)
- Plumbing/remodel fixtures (sinks, toilets, kitchen counters, flooring, tiles, similar items)
- Big box TV's
- In General: Any item that is broken/damaged/dirty beyond a gentle cleaning (includes clothing, furniture, any normal household items, electrical and mechanical machines, tools,
