

### PCUSA Support ..... a.k.a. per capita



Our congregation is a part of the denomination, Presbyterian Church: USA (PCUSA). Being a part of a denomination gives us the support we need to be involved in mission and the sharing of the Gospel of Jesus Christ throughout the world in ways we could not on our own.

The denomination "connects" us to other congregations and resources beyond our own. But it needs structure to run it and support all the mission and ministry outreach.

Each congregation shares in what has been called, per capita, (which we call PCUSA support) in our pledging and giving. We find it a humble honor to be a part of something even bigger than CPC in Tucson. And helping to cover the expenses it takes to run an entire denomination is part of our missional outreach.


Each congregation is assessed an amount based on the number of members. That is why it's been traditionally called, per capita.... Per person. Over the years people have sometimes seen it as a "head tax." But at CPC we have seen it as a part of mission and have encouraged the celebration of being Presbyterian by inviting members to give that amount above and beyond their annual pledge. Some have been able to do so; some consider it part of their pledge.

For 2022, the per member PCUSA cost will be \$45. On Sunday, January 30<sup>th</sup>, we will have a special dedication of our PCUSA support. Pastor Steve will have a friend from seminary who is the Presbytery Executive for Inland Northwest Presbytery in Washington State.

We invite you to make a special donation to CPC in the amount of \$45 that day as we honor our part in the PCUSA. Donations can be given as usual through checks, cash, bill-pay, or our secure online resources (There's a dropdown item for PCUSA support).

Let's celebrate being Presbyterian.

Our next meeting will be on Jan 11 at 1:00 PM on Zoom only. We will discuss **This Tender Land** by William Kent Krueger.

The unforgettable story of four orphans who travel the Mississippi River on a life-changing odyssey during the Great Depression.
