A Word From Our Pastor...



Advent is the Church season that celebrates the coming of Immanuel, God-With-Us. The four Sundays prior to Christmas are used in the Church to help us prepare for the celebration of the birth of Jesus, the Messiah, into

our world and lives. This year it began on Sunday, November 29th. Often when people are preparing for the birth of a baby they "nest." They create a space in their home, their life, for this new life that will be with them. Typically we prepare a nursery, or a space in room.

In Advent, we create a space in our life, in our heart, mind, soul. We make sure there is room for God in our lives. There are fun Advent calendars that you can open each day of December filled with treats of chocolate or toys or devotional message. At Christ Presbyterian Tucson, we prepare by helping to fill the cupboards and shelves of the Food Bank of the eastside Interfaith Community Food Bank (ICS). ICS is a wonderful organization in Tucson that helps Pima County residents who find themselves in need, in many ways. During the Thanksgiving/Christmas holidays, they increase their giving of food to folks in the community and by the end of the year their shelves tend to be quite empty. Each year, we fill those shelves with thousands of pounds of canned and boxed food that they can use into the new year.

We have found that preparing for Jesus coming into our lives by reaching out and helping others is the perfect way to "nest," and celebrate the season of Advent.

We hope you'll join us in this effort. We'll collect all of your non-perishable food donations until Sunday, December 27th, when we will dedicate them in worship and get them to the eastside ICS Food Bank.

If you are worshiping with us only on-line, you can drop them off at the church most any time, but especially by Sunday, December 27. Call Stella in the church office to arrange your drop-off. You can place your donation under the Christmas tree. If it's easier, you can also write a special check to CPC for this project.

Good News! (I'm sure you would like to hear some) CPC took over our Tote food that we had planned to use in March through August and it's almost all used! The family count at the Haven Tote Food Pantry is up and over 80 families. More families are asking for help with food. It has been challenging to find those in need when children are working online.

CPC volunteers are helping at the Food Pantry with bagging individual items like applesauce and breakfast bars, restocking and organizing canned goods and staples, rescuing food from designated grocery stores and prepping for Christmas in the Pantry. Partner churches and Haven Totes, INC have come together to provide shoes, socks, sweatshirts, literature books, and school supplies for each child up to the age of 15. We are hoping that with the New Year, more families in need will find their way to the Haven Tote Food Pantry.

The Book Club will meet on Tuesday December 8, 1:00 p.m. on Skype to talk about the current book selection, In The Bleak Midwinter: A Clare Ferguson/ Russ Van Alstyne Mystery by Julia Spencer-Fleming.

It's a cold, snowy December in the upstate New York town of Millers Kill, and newly ordained Clare Fergusson is on thin ice as the first female priest of its small Episcopal church. The ancient regime running the parish covertly demands that she prove herself as a leader. However, her blunt manner, honed by years as an army pilot, is meeting with a chilly reception from some members of her congregation and Chief of Police Russ Van Alstyne, in particular, doesn't know what to make of her, or how to address "a lady priest" for that matter.

The last thing she needs is trouble, but that is exactly what she finds. When a newborn baby is abandoned on the church stairs and a young mother is brutally murdered, Clare has to pick her way through the secrets and silence that shadow that town like the ever-present Adirondack mountains. As the days dwindle down and the attraction between the avowed priest and the married police chief grows, Clare will need all her faith, tenacity, and courage to stand fast against a killer's icy heart.

In the Bleak Midwinter is one of the most outstanding Malice Domestic winners the contest has seen. The compelling atmosphere-the kind of very cold and snowy winter that is typical of upstate New York-will make you reach for another sweater. The characters are fully and believably drawn and you will feel like they are your old friends and find yourself rooting for them every step of the way.
