

In addition to all of the support listed above, and all of the other giving you will find throughout this brochure, and all of the mission support that doesn't get recorded, CPC donates \$12,000 in the year to the General Mission of denomination, the majority of which supports our Presbytery.

Arizona taxpayers have opportunity to make contributions to three different kinds of organizations. The donation directly reduces the amount of tax owed to the state or increases the amount of the taxpayers refund, dollar for dollar. You need to have a tax liability for at least the amount of your donation to take the tax credit.

At this time, we plan to help 6 families, and hope to add at least one more.


Often times, Kellond school calls at the last minute to say one or two of their families need help with Christmas and the CPC congregation steps right up.
