Haven Totes Tax Credit and Donation Form

An Arizona Charitable Tax Credit for helping low income residents of Arizona can be taken in addition to tax credits for helping Arizona schools. Report donations on AZ Form 321. Arizona allows until April 15 to qualify for a tax credit for the previous year. An individual may be eligible for a tax credit up to \$400 filing single, or \$800 filing taxes jointly. Your tax credit will be applied to reduce your tax liability, dollar-for-dollar actual credit off the amount you pay in state taxes. Please consult your tax advisor.

Although it is common to want to find our own way through grief and avoid seeking help, grief



support can make a difference. Experiencing the death of a loved one can often overwhelm our ability to cope; some things are simply bigger than we are and require more resources in times of need. Most of us feel

strengthened, encouraged, and supported when we learn about grief, understand how grief affects us, identify coping strategies and learn new methods to help ourselves through the grief experience. Casa de la Luz bereavement groups and counseling provide support to the Tucson community, regardless of whether your loved one was cared for by our hospice or not. All groups and counseling are open to the public and are free of charge.



We have chosen to read Finding Dorothy by Elizabeth Letts for our January meeting. We will meet Tues, Jan 14 at I PM in the Patio Room.



As soon as she learns that M-G-M is adapting her late husband's masterpiece for the screen, seventy-seven-year-old Maud Gage Baum sets about trying to finagle her way onto the set. Nineteen years after Frank's passing, Maud is the only person who can help the producers stay true to the spirit of the book-because she's the only one left who knows its secrets. But the moment she hears Judy Garland rehearsing the first notes of "Over the Rainbow," Maud recognizes the yearning that defined her own life story, from her youth as a suffragette's daughter to her coming of age as one of the first women in the lvy League, from her blossoming romance with Frank to the hardscrabble prairie years that inspired . Judy reminds Maud of a young girl she cared for and tried to help in South Dakota, a dreamer who never got her happy ending. Now, with the young actress under pressure from the studio as well as her ambitious stage mother, Maud resolves to protect her-the way she tried so hard to protect the real Dorothy. The author of two bestselling nonfiction books and Elizabeth Letts is a master at discovering and re-searching a rich historical story and transforming it into a page-turner. is the result of Letts's journey into the amazing lives of Frank and Maud Baum. Written as fiction but based closely on the truth, Elizabeth Letts's new book tells a story of love, loss, inspiration, and perseverance, set in America's heartland
