On April 10 I fell from a ladder incurring a fracture to my upper right shoulder and fracturing (shattering) both of my heels. What a mess!

I'm am so grateful for the many ways you all have contacted me, especially your prayers, both for me

and my full-time caregiver, Debbie, my wife! You all have bolstered me through some very difficult moments.

I am totally non-weight bearing to my feet for a minimum of six weeks. Because of my need to focus on healing my heels (and shoulder), I have taken short-term medical leave. I will be away from you until at least June I<sup>st</sup>. I am working with our Personnel Team and Session Leadership Team to see how I do in the progress of healing to know if I will need to take more time than that.

In my absence our Personnel team has come alongside our paid staff in even closer ways and will continue to be sure they have the support they need. Steve Brownson, Laura Manning, and Debby Anderson have coordinated worship. Debby Anderson continues to coordinate pastoral care needs within the congregation.

I am so humbled to know that you all have volunteered in so many ways to continue our church family's ministry and mission in my absence.

I'll be back. I may not be walking for a while, but I'll be back and we'll follow Jesus Christ as he leads us into the fullness of God's grace... together.



The Book Club will meet via Skype on Tuesday, May 11, 1:00 p.m. to discuss the current selection:

#### The Underground Railroad A Novel by Colson Whitehead



Winner of the Pulitzer Prize and the

National Book Award, this #I New York Times bestseller chronicles a young slave's adventures as she makes a desperate bid for freedom in the antebellum South.

Cora is a slave on a cotton plantation in Georgia. An outcast even among her fellow Africans, she is on the cusp of womanhood—where greater pain awaits. And so when Caesar, a slave who has recently arrived from Virginia, urges her to join him on the Underground Railroad, she seizes the opportunity and escapes with him.

In Colson Whitehead's ingenious conception, the Underground Railroad is no mere metaphor: engineers and conductors operate a secret network of actual tracks and tunnels beneath the Southern soil. Cora embarks on a harrowing flight from one state to the next, encountering, like Gulliver, strange yet familiar iterations of her own world at each stop.

As Whitehead brilliantly re-creates the terrors of the antebellum era, he weaves in the saga of our nation, from the brutal abduction of Africans to the unfulfilled promises of the present day. *The Underground Railroad* is both the gripping tale of one woman's will to escape the horrors of bondage—and a powerful meditation on the history we all share.

Due to circumstances that keep us from disposing of or passing along particular unsold items at the end of the 3-day sale, or the lack of storage for unsold items, we can no longer accept the following things:

- · Mattresses of any size, condition, or quality.
- · Mechanical beds and chairs (medical or lift type).
- · Large appliances (stoves, refrigerators, dishwashers, built-in microwaves or ovens, washers, dryers, etc.)
- Plumbing/remodel fixtures (sinks, toilets, kitchen counters, flooring, tiles, similar items)

In general: We ask that you do not donate any item that is broken/ damaged/dirty beyond a gentle cleaning (this includes clothing, furniture, any household items, electrical and mechanical machines, tools, etc.).
