



Lent... Give it up but be careful what you fill it with!

Tradition calls us to “give something up for Lent.” Sacrifice is a spiritual discipline. It allows the faithful to learn to live more simply, to rely more on God than ourselves and especially on our stuff! So, over the generations we

have been encouraged to make a sacrifice during Lent.

If you are going to give something up, make it something meaningful. A break from chocolate might be good for you, if chocolate is controlling you and taking you away from God. Otherwise, we call that a diet.

Perhaps giving up an extra moment in the day when you might check your social media, and taking that time to pray.... Might be a better spiritual discipline.

For most of us, when we take something out of our lives, we fill our lives with something else. So, don't give up chocolate to eat a carrot. It may be healthier for you, but we still call that a diet.

When you give something up and make more room for God in your life, we call that a spiritual discipline. So, taking away a moment when you are mindlessly exploring what other people post about their dinners, and take time to pray with God, you are learning to grow your relationship with God.

Now that's what Lent is about. And sacrificing those human things, allows more room for Spirit. Welcome to the season of Lent. Lent will lead you to the Empty Tomb... which is filled with Grace. Hmmm. Wasn't God smart!

This prayerful service allows worshipers moments of deeper contemplation in the Word of God. Gathering around the Table, even more intimately than usual, allows participants a chance to imagine themselves at the original table with Jesus.

A LENTEN SERVICE OF REPENTANCE, MEDITATION AND PRAYER

Lent, in the Christian tradition, is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is the season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter Sunday. Sundays are not counted in the forty days, because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

*The word, lent, comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry. Lent is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others.*

On March 4 at 5:30, for our First Saturday of the Month Meditation Service, we will continue our time of reflection that we begin on Ash Wednesday and we will gather to **praise God, pray together**, reflect on Psalm 32 and listen for the Spirit of God to speak to our hearts. And we will, as we always do, celebrate the Lord's Supper, in memory of the sacrifice Jesus made on our behalf. Please join us as we once again meet in the Upper Room of Christ Presbyterian Church.





'March Madness' of a different kind...

We on the Flea Market Team use the term "March Madness" to describe the flurry of activity that takes place from the time we begin occupying the classrooms and grassy quad church campus areas that will hold everything not in the MPR, or furniture and large appliances.

Beginning March 5, the minute Sunday morning classes are over in rooms A/B, E/F & 6/7, they will be transformed into clothing, art, and record/cd/movie shops. The grassy quad will be filled with shoes, garden supplies and plants. Tools and suitcases of all sizes will like the surrounding sidewalks. Toys, stuffed animals, pet supplies, household cleaning supplies, sporting equipment and oh – so much more will completely cover the lawn.

To get those items in place, we will need to empty another pod. Yup – sorry to say, but true. We have one pod packed to the gills with outdoor items destined for the grass quad.

In the MPR, there are mounds of clothes that will need to be schlepped into rooms A/B & E/F. Huge amounts of art, and media items need to be ferried over to rooms 6/7.

Of course, many tables will be needed for those spots. We need more tables if you can lend for those rooms. If you can stay after Adult Bible class, Youth or Sunday Funday schools, to help with the set-up of these areas, that would be awesome!

The days between March 5 and March 15, you will find us at church every day between 8 and 2, while we plug away at the process of getting ready for the Huge Flea Market (Mar 16-18).

- **Furniture & Large Appliances:** There are three (3) pods FULL of furniture and large appliances that will need to be emptied before the pod projects are complete for 2017.

Unloading date will be either March 12, or March 15 (discussion is in progress of setting up these heavy items in the church parking lot, rather than in the FH and front brick patio area). But “heavy lifters” will be sorely needed on one of those days!

- **Fellowship Hall Set Up:** The Fellowship Hall will need to be emptied of excess round tables on Sunday, March 12, after 1st service, to allow for the Flea Market transformation.
- **Green Valley:** For those who had planned to go with us to Green Valley this year to help us glean their Patio Sale items, on Sat Mar 11, *that pick-up has been cancelled. You may erase that circle from your calendar from this year only. Next year remains to be determined.*
- **Volunteer Only, Shopping Night:** To ensure that you can use your 20% off coupon before the expiration date of March 15, we on the Flea Market Team have planned a special pre-sale shopping night just for you. On Wednesday, March 15, between 6-8 pm, the campus will be open to 20% coupon holders only. Get your coupon before March 12 and begin shopping! Flea Market Team Leads will be on the brick patio most Sunday mornings for the next few weeks, or come see us in the MPR on the following days: M, T, Th, Sat & Sun 8am -2pm. (You may use your coupon at any time after you receive it, until it expires at 8 pm on March 15.)
- **Post-Event Clean Up:** The sale is over at 2 pm on Saturday, March 18. Clean up begins immediately. The campus must be ready for worship on Sunday morning. Many hands make light work. Please stay and help...even if the Cats are in the other “March Madness” event. The sooner we finish, the sooner we all enjoy the game!

Book Club


