A Word From Our Pastor...



Lent is the season in the church of penitence, reflection, and preparation. Penitence: the action of feeling regretful, sorrowful for wrongdoings Reflection: on what God in Christ endured that we might be forgiven Preparation: to celebrate the Grace of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ

For most of Christianity, it's a season of sacrifice, giving something up, that you might get focused on the joy of the Resurrection. For me, that doesn't work. We tend to create what we focus on, so, if my focus is on what I'm giving up, I just think more about that. Instead, I take something on. Doing so, focuses my attention on what I am trying to grow in, to know more of, to become.

This year, I invite you to take on worship attendance, from Ash Wednesday (February 26) to Resurrection Sunday (Easter) on April 12. Each worship will give you an opportunity to focus on Psalm 23, each time a particular part of the psalm. Each week will feature a presentation by one of the characters Haste brought to the manger of Jesus. You will see how encountering the baby Jesus, following him throughout his ministry, led people deeper into their faith. Resurrection Sunday will find Haste at the empty tomb, forever changed by the Christ.

Haste? Yes, remember, the Shepherds went with Haste to see what the angels had told them as they were watching their flocks by night. There they found the babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, in a manger. There they held the very presence of God, and found their lives changed, forever.

Come and experience, in person or on-line, the ways our faith in God through Jesus changes our lives.

Haven Totes Tax Credit and Donation Form

An Arizona Charitable Tax Credit for helping low income residents of Arizona can be taken in addition to tax credits for helping Arizona schools. Report donations on AZ Form 321. Arizona allows until April 15 to qualify for a tax credit for the previous year. An individual may be eligible for a tax credit up to \$400 filing single, or \$800 filing taxes jointly. Your tax credit will be applied to reduce your tax liability, dollar-for-dollar actual credit off the amount you pay in state taxes. Please consult your tax advisor.
