

## Stewardship and Finance Page

Vision 2020 has been our theme for this year's annual stewardship campaign. We are so grateful that so many were able to not only make a pledge but fulfill that pledge in such a challenging year to be a part of the church. We are so grateful for the giving of so many who weren't able to make a pledge but were generous in their support of the ministry and mission of our church family.



We hoped this would be a really clear year (20-20 vision), but it became cloudy... for a while. We learned that mission and ministry can still be done, even if we can't worship in the same space. And we did lots of it this year. We even expanded as we were blessed with extra financial support to help those whose income had suffered because of the pandemic closures. And because of all this, 2020 really did become clear.... There is a tie that binds us together that cannot be broken.



As we look to 2021 our Session Leadership Team plans to keep the overall budget the same, but to make some changes within it. We are rearranging how monies are spent. We'll keep a focus on our facilities to ensure they are disinfected, clean, and safe. We'll re-focus monies toward technologies that will enhance our worship and faith growth experience both on the campus and on the internet. We are looking at how we connect to people more deeply online through teaching and fellowship, all the while looking at how we re-connect people in those ministries on the campus as time progresses and it is safe to do so.

We encourage you now to begin considering and praying about how you can make a pledge toward the 2021 annual stewardship campaign, "Blessed Be the Tie that Binds." We will be highlighting parts of our budget and ministries on Sundays in worship and dedicating our pledges for 2021 on Sunday, November 1st. Special mailings will be coming to you this month as we prepare to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ in 2021.

## Christmas Cards For Our Troops

Your Mission Team came upon an idea that will bring a smile to many during the holidays. It turns out that our deployed troops have difficulty finding Christmas cards to send home to their friends and family. In 2016 a group of women started making cards and sending them abroad to fill this need. We think this sounds like something CPC can help provide.

Here is what is needed:

- •A2 size cards (4 1/2 inches by 5 1/2 inches, half of a standard sheet of paper) card stock is best.
- Envelopes size A2
- NO GLITTER. Twine, foil paper, and ribbon are fine.
- Other than any greetings you put on the card (Merry Christmas! etc.), DO NOT PERSONALIZE OR SIGN. Remember, these are for the troops to write and send to their family and friends.
- You might want to make some aimed at young children.
- Yes! Let your children participate in making the cards! They will be loved and cherished.

May you all continue to be safe and stay well. May you feel God's love now and always.




