Sunday Worship

Sunday, September 6: One Service Broadcast at 10 a.m.

As we begin the month we will join Pastor Lesley Abrams and the congregation of St. John in the Desert for a combined online service where we will all be celebrating communion together. We'll broadcast together at 10 a.m. Be sure to join us with your communion supplies.

Sunday, September 13: 8:30 a.m. / 10:45 a.m.

We will begin our combined online and in-person worship services.

Beginning Sunday, September 13th (unless our stats in Pima County/Tucson change drastically), we will begin to welcome people back into the worship spaces or to remain online, whichever is best for them. Our worship will be a hybrid of live-led and pre-recorded videos to enhance the experience of worship for those who remain online and those who choose to be come to the campus. Both services will take place in the Sanctuary, utilizing an every other pew distancing plan. We will email a "Sign-Up Genius" in the week prior to get an idea of how many to expect in worship.

If the State/County/City statistics change, we will remain online only until it is safer to worship together. We are so grateful for everyone's patience and understanding throughout this pandemic. We're doing what we faithfully can to provide as safe an environment as possible. Worshipers assume their own risk by attending in person, Worshipers are asked to follow CDC guidelines:

- **Masks will be required** at least through the month of September.
- Hand Sanitizing stations will be available at the entrance.
- Worshipers will sit in alternating pews, keeping distance between different households.
- (Alternating pews will be changed between services)
- Offering will be received by ushers at the door.
- Attendance pads will not be used/shared.

Music will be led by leaders or virtual choirs; Congregational singing will not occur at least through

the month of September.

Sermons will continue to be a combination of preached live in the pulpit or pre-recorded from another site. You know Pastor Steve... you just don't know where he will show us the Word of God!

Fellowship Food/coffee will not be served; water bottles will be available, though we encourage you to bring your own, if needed.

Please do not attend if you have any signs or symptoms of illness. We want to faithfully care for each other in the process of returning.

We know that many will need to stay online only. Our commitment is to recreate worship in such a way as to provide an inspirational experience both for those in the room and those online. We will be welcoming your feedback as we move into that hybrid model of worship fully into the future.⁵
